HOUSE PARTY

The San Francisco Decorator Showcase gives designers rare freedom to dream big. Ahead of this year's opening, participating creatives share the inspiration and imagination behind their rooms.

For the 47th year in a row, the San Francisco Decorator Showcase returns April 25 through May 25, 2026. The annual event is a fundraiser for University High School's financial aid program and, since its inception, has donated more than \$21 million to the school. A new group of designers is selected every January, and then they have four months to put together their room.

The house changes every year, and the current one is 2315 Broadway, a home built in 1897 by architect Moses J. Lyon. The 10,000 square-foot historic residence boasts sweeping Bay views and preserved architectural character. Walking through the elaborately designed mansion is something we look forward to every spring. For interior design aficionados, it's a way to be inspired, and for the designers who participate in the house, it's a chance to showcase their personal style.

As Robbie McMillan of AubreyMaxwell puts it, the Decorator Showcase is "the opportunity to swing from the treetops! Showcase is our moment to interpret a space, a home, a piece of architecture through our own unique lens." It's a designer's chance to implement a bold vision that may not get a green light from a client.
